- **Picture 1** Matt and Molly are in art class. They're working with **clay**.
- **Picture 2** Matt gets some pink clay, and he rolls it between his hands. Molly gets some **tan** clay, and she rolls it with a **rolling pin**.
- **Picture 3** Matt's **shape** looks like a hot dog. Molly's shape looks like a hot dog roll. They put the two shapes together. They get an **idea** to play a **joke** on someone!

Wh- Question

Who should have a joke played on her?

(HINT FOR STUDENT — The answer to a "who" question is going to be a person.)

- **Picture 4a** Molly says, "Mrs. Koski, we have a snack for you." Mrs. Koski opens her mouth to take a bite. Matt says, "Stop! It's just a joke."
- **Picture 4b** Molly says, "Katie, we have a snack for you." Katie opens her mouth to take a bite. Matt says, "Stop! It's just a joke."
